The 5-finger rule

To find a good reading level, choose a book. Open to any page. Read it. On your hand, count the number of new words.

0-1 new words = too easy.

2-3 = This level is perfect!

4 = This is a "challenge" level.

It is a little difficult. But you can try it if the book seems really interesting.

5 or more = Too difficult.

If a book is too difficult, you probably

won't enjoy it.

- 1. Use the 5-Finger Rule to find an easy book.
- 2. Read the information on the back cover.
- 3. Look at the pictures, too.
- 4. Start to read it!
- 5. Don't look up any words if you can almost understand it.
- 6. Try to read quickly.
- 7. Don't translate the words into your own language.
- 8. Just read and enjoy the story!
- 9. If the book is too difficult, stop reading and find another one!
- 10. Write down the information in your log.
